Mission

The Internet Society supports and promotes the development of the Internet as a global technical infrastructure, a resource to enrich people's lives, and a force for good in society. Our work aligns with our goals for the Internet to be open, globally-connected, secure, and trustworthy. We seek collaboration with all who share these goals.

Together, we focus on:

- Building and supporting the communities that make the Internet work;
- Advancing the development and application of Internet infrastructure, technologies, and open standards; and
- Advocating for policy that is consistent with our view of the Internet.

Strategic Goals

Open

An open Internet is one where anyone may create, use, or deploy the Internet and its technologies according to their own wishes.

Globally Connected

A globally-connected Internet is one in which everything and everyone that wants a connection can get one that is good enough to satisfy the desire, or that any set of nodes that wish to inter-connect can do so in a manner that is good enough to satisfy the desire.

Secure

The Internet is secure when it does not make any person, organization, or society overall more vulnerable than they are without it.

Trustworthy

The Internet is trustworthy when it is designed, built, and deployed so that people can justifiably believe it will not be a threat and not betray their expectations.
